


Medicaid Expansion and Dental Benefits Coverage

PERCENTAGE CHANGE IN THE NUMBER OF ADULTS WITH MEDICAID DUE TO THE AFFORDABLE CARE ACT



*North Dakota does not cover dental services for the adult expansion population of approximately 21,000. Therefore, we subtracted 21,000 from the total number of adults with Medicaid dental coverage in 2017.
