ADA Foundation Dental Student Scholarship Program

The ADA Foundation (ADAF) offers a \$2,500 scholarship to students who are U.S. citizens, currently enrolled full-time as an entering second-year student in an accredited dental school, can demonstrate financial need and have a minimum of a 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale). Approximately 25 scholarships are awarded each year and two applications may be forwarded to the ADAF by each dental school.

Minority Scholarships

The ADA Foundation also offers a \$2,500 scholarship to students who meet the above requirements and are also members of one of the following underrepresented groups in the dental profession: African American, Hispanic or Native American. Approximately 25 scholarships are awarded each year and two applications may be forwarded to the ADAF by each dental school. Minority applicants are encouraged to apply for both scholarships.
