PENNSYLVANIA DENTIST INSTALLED AS ADA TRUSTEE

CHICAGO, October 6, 2009 —Charles R. Weber, D.M.D., a general dentist based in West Chester, Pa., was installed today as a trustee of the American Dental Association (ADA). Dr. Weber's installation took place in Honolulu at the ADA's 150th Annual Session and World Marketplace Exhibition.

Dr. Weber will serve on the ADA Board of Trustees as the trustee from the Third District, which represents Pennsylvania. The ADA Board formulates and reviews policies and programs and makes recommendations to the members of the ADA's governing body, the House of Delegates. Dr. Weber is a graduate of Seton Hall University and the University of Pennsylvania School of Dental Medicine. He maintains a private practice in West Chester, Pa. Dr. Weber and his wife, Karen, reside in East Goshen, Pa., and are the parents of three adult children.
