The Data

- Based on ADA Health Policy Institute (HPI) Dental Office Database supplemented with data from Fluent.
- Significant improvement in accuracy compared to earlier data releases. Nevertheless, we had
 to make some methodological choices that lead us to believe we are still undercounting
 slightly the number of dentists affiliated with DSOs and larger groups.
- Analysis is based on all practicing dentists in the U.S. for whom HPI can assign at least one
 practice location address. This includes 193,550 dentists out of 203,631 practicing dentists in
 the U.S. in 2023.
- Analysis is by dentist demographics, specialty, career stage and by state.


Definitions for this Analysis

- **Dental Practice Size**: The number of affiliated locations within a dental practice. This could include locations directly owned and operated by a single business entity, as well as locations affiliated with each other through other arrangements such as a franchise, a parent company, or through a DSO. Dental practice size is based on counts of locations across the U.S., regardless of DSO affiliation.
- Dental Support Organization (DSO) Affiliation: A practice is considered to be affiliated with a DSO if some outside entity manages some or all of its non-clinical functions such as billing, marketing, human resources, etc. For the purposes of HPI's analysis, a DSO includes any member of ADSO as well as other entities judged to be DSOs based on extensive HPI primary research, regardless of practice size.









Dental Practice Size - Solo




Dental Practice Size – At Least 10 Locations

Between 2022 and 2023, there was a slight increase in the percentage of dentists in practices of 100+ locations and a slight decrease in solo practices. This trends was similar for all dentists combined and for dentists up to 10 years out of dental school.

In 2023, we saw an uptick of dentists in dental practices of 100+ locations across all specialties and an equivalent decrease of dentists in solo practice.



DSO Affiliation Trended


Percent of Dentists Affiliated with a Dental Support Organization (DSO), 2015-2023





DSO Affiliation by Career Stage


Percent of Dentists Affiliated with a Dental Support Organization(DSO) by Career Stage, 2022 and 2023

DSO Affiliation by State


Percent of Dentists Affiliated with a Dental Support Organization (DSO) by State, 2023


In 2023, DSO affiliation went up for every dental specialty. Orthodontists and oral and maxillofacial surgeons are the most likely to be affiliated with DSOs compared to other specialists.

Some Quick Takeaways

- From 2022 to 2023, in terms of practice size a few key trends continued: dentists in practices with 100+ locations went up, and dentists in solo practice went down. There was also an increase of the percentage of dentists affiliated with a DSO. These trends vary by dentist state, specialty and years of experience.
- In 2023, 26.0% of new dentists (those less than 10 years out of dental school) were affiliated with group practices with at least 10 locations, up from 24.2% in 2022.
- Dentists most likely to be affiliated with DSOs are new dentists, female dentists, and certain specialists (e.g., orthodontists and oral surgeons). Dentists in certain states are also more likely to be part of DSOs. Nearly one-quarter of dentists in Colorado, Nevada, and Georgia are affiliated with DSOs.
